Days of the Week

Monday - Lunes

(wensday) Wednesday – Miércoles

Friday - Viernes

Sunday - Domingo

Weekend – Fin de semana

For example: On wednesdays I go to the park with my child.

The "S" rule

It is used when we talk about:

- 1. A third party (he, she, it)**
- 2. In simple present**
- 3. In affirmative form**

We will add a letter "s" at the end of the verb.

If a verb ends in *consonant + y*, I will replace the “y” for “ies”

I

cry

You

cry

He

cries

She

cries

It

cries

They

cry

We

cry



This rule doesn't apply to verbs that end with *vowel + y*

I	play
You	play
He	plays
She	plays
It	plays
They	play
We	play



If the verb ends with *s, z, sh, x, ch*, we add “es”

I	fix
You	fix
He	fixes
She	fixes
It	Fixes
They	fix
We	fix



Irregular verbs

I	Have
You	Have
He	Has
She	Has
It	Has
They	Have
We	Have



Irregular verbs

I	Do
You	Do
He	Does
She	Does
It	Does
They	Do
We	Do



Irregular verbs

I	Go
You	Go
He	Goes
She	Goes
It	Goes
They	Go
We	Go
