Future Tense: Will and Going to

WILL is used for

Predictions

Spontaneous decisions

GOING TO is used for

Predictions

Plans or intentions

Note: In many cases, "will" and "going to" can be used interchangeably.

Will & Going to

😊 + **will** + main verb

I will take the call in my office

😊 + **won't** + main verb

They won't attend to the meeting

Will + 😊 + main verb

Will robots *take over* our jobs?

😊 + **be** + going to + verb

I **am** going to travel to London

😊 + **be** + not + going to + verb

She **is** not going to call me

Be + 😊 + going to + verb

Are they going to come?

FUTURE PLANS

DIRECTIONS: Remember that 'going to' is used to talk about planned things. Talk about your future plans using 'going to' in its positive or negative form. **FOLLOW THE EXAMPLE**

Talk about the things you are going to do in the near future. These plans can include:

- Are you going to travel this year?
- Are you going to get married?
- Are you going to buy a house or move to a new place?
- Do you have plans to change jobs or study something new?

Example: I'm going to travel to Spain this summer. I want to visit Barcelona and Madrid. I'm very excited about this trip.

I'm not going to change my job this year because I like my job now.
I'm not going to get married, at least not this year...



SPONTANEOUS DECISIONS

DIRECTIONS: Remember that 'Will' is used for spontaneous decisions made at the moment. Answer the following questions without thinking too much about your response. Use Will in its affirmative or negative form, then make a question for one of your classmates.

- Will you watch a movie or series today?
- What will you do after class?
- Will you go out this weekend?
- Will you visit anyone tomorrow?

LIFE IN THE FUTURE

DIRECTIONS: Life is going to be very different in the future. Make your predictions using will and going to. Use the vocabulary below. FOLLOW THE EXAMPLE

Flying cars	Voice control
Travel to space	Work from home
Smart home	Online meetings
Robots	Flexible hours
Smart glasses	IA
Robot Pets	Take over (replace) Look after

Life will be very different in the future. Houses are going to be smart homes with voice control, so you won't have to move to turn on the TV. People will **take over** real dogs, they will have robot pets to **look after** their houses.
