# TRAVELING

DIRECTIONS: check the vocabulary, read the text and answer the questions

## Future time clauses

are used to talk about actions that will happen after a certain point in time. They are introduced by words like "when," "as soon as," "until," "before," "once," and "after." These clauses help us understand the sequence of events or actions in the future.



# Examples

We'll check the weather **once** we leave the house.

I'll pack my suitcase **before** I go to the airport.

**As soon as** we land, I'll call my family.

We won't buy the tickets **until** we find a cheap flight.

**When** I arrive at the hotel, I'll take a shower.

I'll send you a postcard **after** I visit the Eiffel Tower.
